

Documenting Well-Child Visits for NFP

Well-Child Visit:

What are we measuring?



HVSA Aligned Measure: Percent of children enrolled in home visiting who received the last recommended visit based on the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) schedule.

Instructions: We recommend documenting this data as soon as you learn about a well-child visit.

Which form should I use to document Well-Child Visits?

1. Use the Healthcare Services Form for Well-Child Visits.

This data is collected at the following timepoints: whenever a mom or baby accesses healthcare services **AND** at the routine data collection timepoints of child's age 6, 12, 18, and 24 months.

- Remember to enter the date this assessment was done.
- Enter under the child on the Healthcare Services Form.

2. Record the client's answer to question 2 on the Healthcare Services Form.

- Select the well-child visit completed.
 - Enter this form under the child.

3. Enter the information on the Form into FLO.

- If a home visit did not occur around the most recent age requiring a well-child visit, then data from the previous expected well-child visit should be reported.
