- On July 11, Gov. Inslee authorized DCYF to pursue leasing of new physical space.
  Options are under review. We will share as they become available.
- DCYF resumed intakes from county jails on August 9, after reaching agreement with county plaintiff. The number of new intakes will rise after today (8/12).
