System-Level PBC Contracts



Focus on Capacity Building

Some DCYF contracts focus on building the capacity of contractors and/or entire systems of care (e.g. juvenile justice system) rather than only funding direct service provision.



Variation in Services and/or Contractors

These contract groups operate more like grant programs, funding different services across contractors and/or significantly changing contractors each cycle, making it difficult to measure standardized PBC metrics over time.

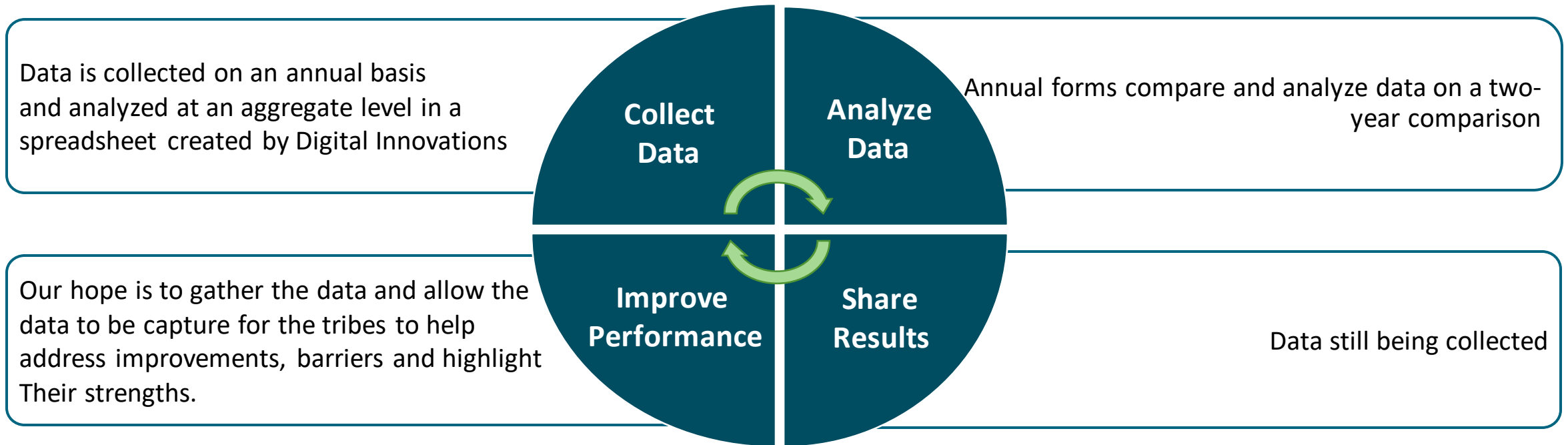

Tribal Services: FY23 PBC Results

- This is the second year that PBC quality and outcome metrics have been implemented
 - Difficult to implement
 - Need to look at logic model - Nothing like medicine wheel or relating to Tribes.
 - Tribes were exempt from implementation of PBC

- Completing the literature review and theory of change, and then using those findings to drive the retrospective data analysis, updated logic model template, and feedback loop

Tribal Services: FY23 Research & Data Analysis Findings

- Draft Literature Review sent to Tribes
 - How can we use the literature review to honor Indigenous values and current Tribal programming?
 - Our goal is to actively involve the Tribes
- Once the literature review is finalized, that research will:
 - Determine the need of a retrospective data analysis
 - Drive the conversation of a revised logic model with tribal input
