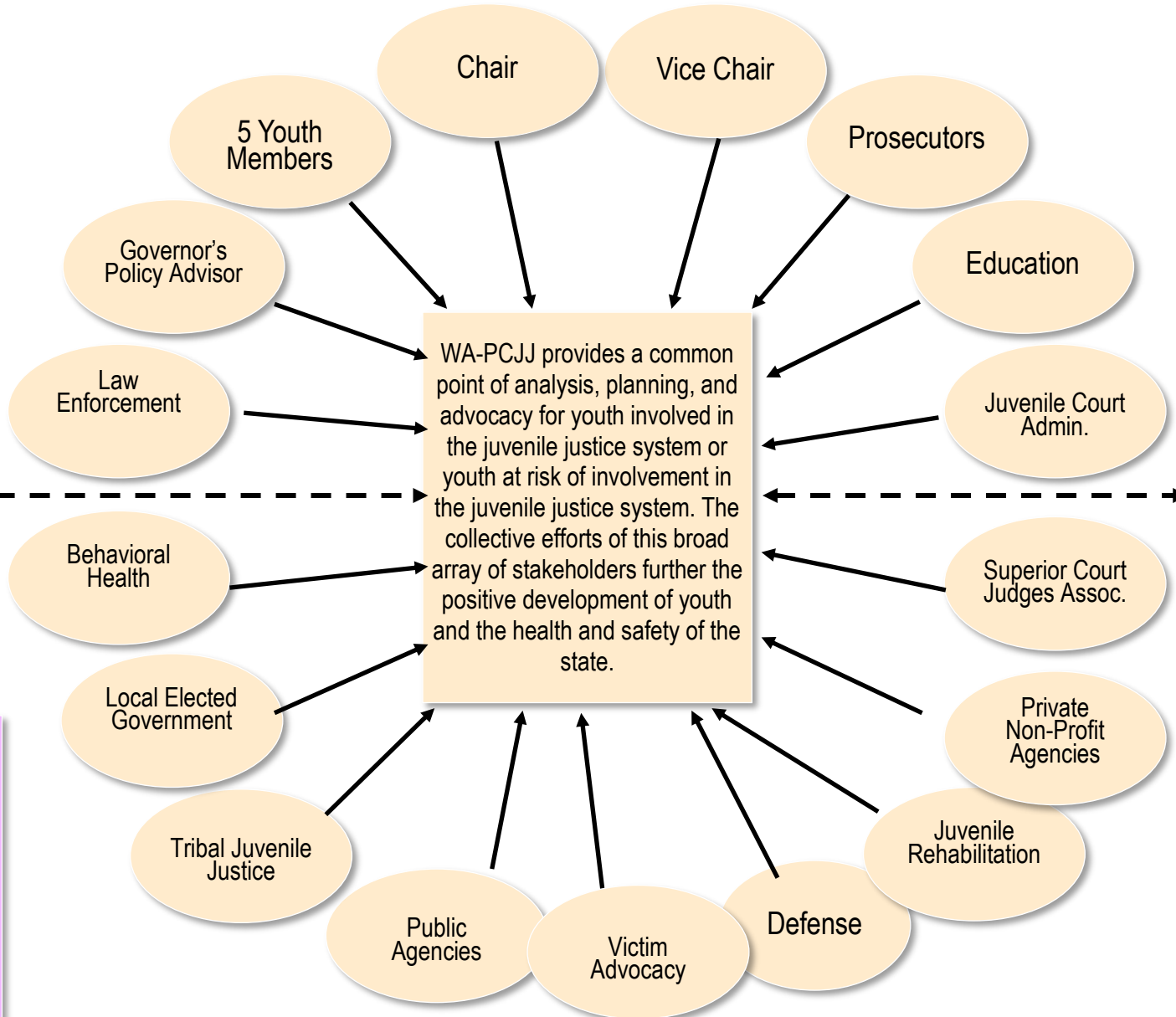

The Office of Juvenile Justice (OJJ) envisions Washington's children and youth are healthy, educated, and free from violence. If they come into contact with the juvenile justice system, the contact should be rare, fair, and beneficial to them.

The Role of the Office of Juvenile Justice:

- Supporting and staffing the Washington State Partnership Council on Juvenile Justice (WA-PCJJ)
- Monitoring federal compliance with core requirements of the Juvenile Justice Reform Act of 2018 (HR 6964).
- Administering the Title II Formula Grant and other funding resources to incentivize juvenile justice system improvements at local, county and state levels.
- Supporting implementation of the Juvenile Detention Alternative Initiative (JDAI) model in partnership with local JDAI sites.
- Providing technical assistance and serving as a resource for Washington State's juvenile justice improvement initiatives
