This report is prepared in compliance with SB 5187, Section 229 (4)(e), which directs the Washington State Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) to report enrollments and active caseload for the working connections child care program to the Governor and the legislative fiscal committees and the Legislative-Executive WorkFirst Poverty Reduction Oversight Task Force on an agreed upon schedule, reporting as of Dec 31, and June 30, of each year. The report shall also identify the number of cases participating in both Temporary Assistance for Needy Families and Working Connections Child Care. DCYF must also report on the number of children served through contracted slots.
