- Approved by the Office of Juvenile Justice & Delinquency Prevention
- Intended to be responsive to qualitative and quantitative data analysis specific to each state
- Guides activities and spending for the subsequent 3-year period
- Identifies measures for success

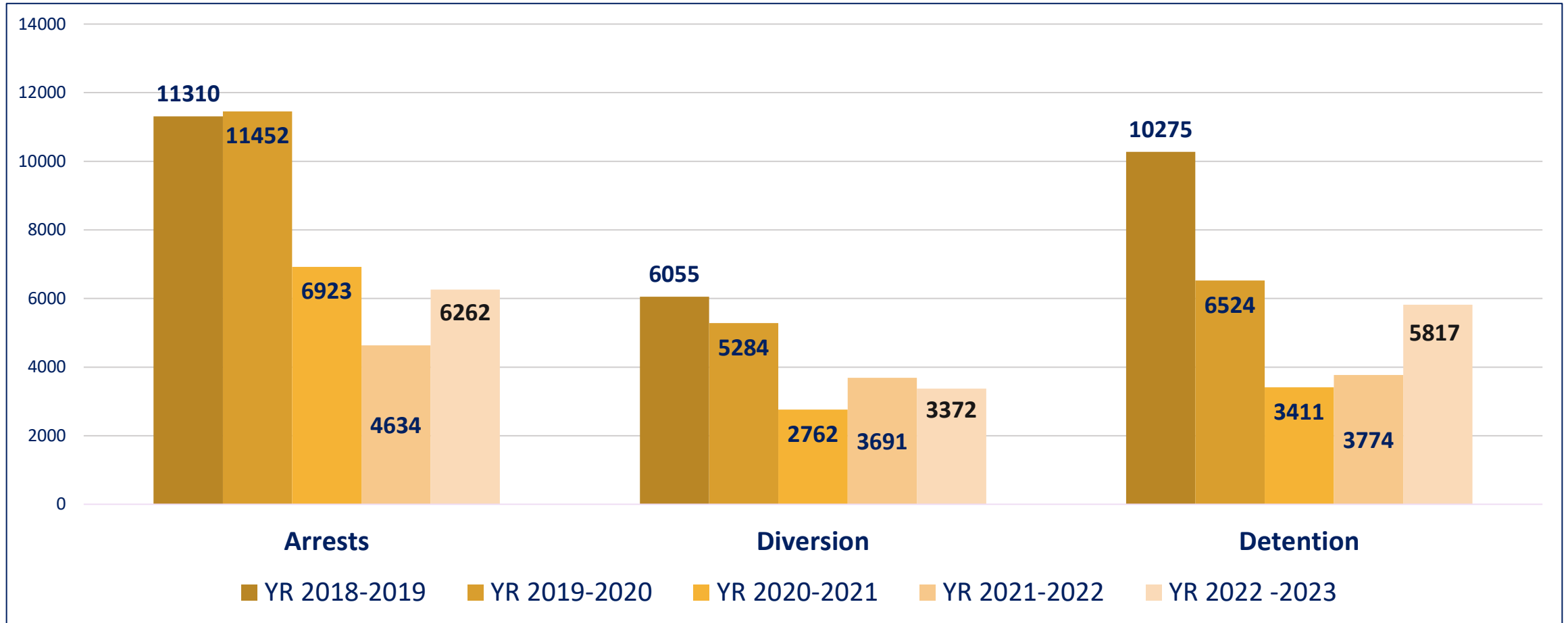

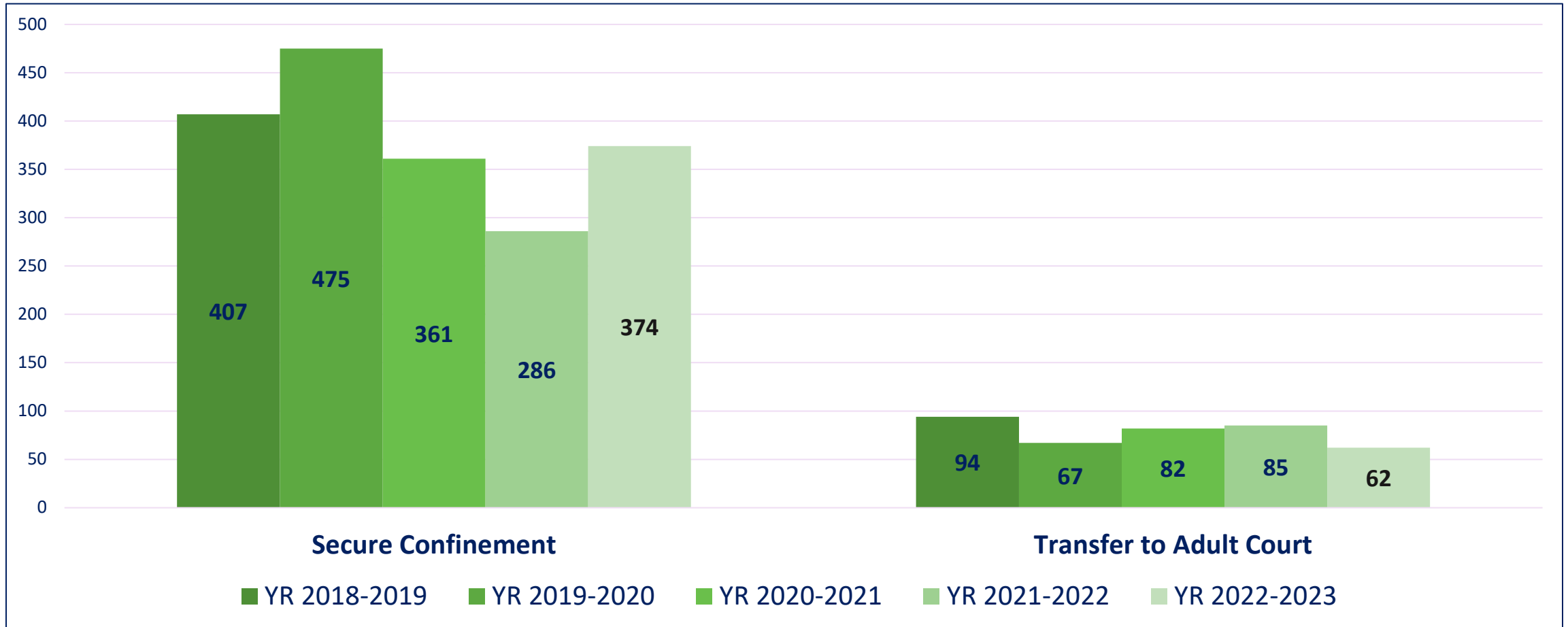
Washington State Racial & Ethnic Disparities at Five Data Points

Title II 3 Year Plan– Overarching Goal

Reduce the impact of Racial and Ethnic Disparities on Youth of Color involved with or at risk of involvement with the local and state juvenile justice systems.



Overarching Goal: Reduce Racial & Ethnic Disparities

Funding

- Juvenile Justice Data Dashboard
- Strategies for Youth (SFY) Trainings
- Support Public Defense

Advocacy & Collaboration

- Expand use of the Data Dashboard
- Increase awareness among law enforcement agencies of the SFY resources
- Collaborate to create a pathway of practice in rural communities



Title II 3 Year Plan– Proposed Priority Areas

Priority Area 1: Early Intervention

- Support upstream systems in responding more effectively and compassionately to the needs of children and young people.

Priority Area 2: Reduction in System Involvement

- Continue to support the reduction of the number of youth who enter the juvenile justice system through providing funding and capacity building to community-based organizations serving youth via positive youth development programming in lieu of court involvement and/or detention admission.

Priority Area 3: Supportive Re-Entry

- Collaborate with systems responsible for serving youth in the deep end of the system with a focus on supportive re-entry and Transition Aged Youth Programming.



Priority Area 1: Early Intervention

Funding

- After School Programs for Elementary & Middle School
- Training for Teachers, Administrators & School Resource Officers

Advocacy & Collaboration

- Collaborate with Tribes
- Partner with OSPI in training & curriculum identification
- Assess the effectiveness of the Designated Crisis Responder System

- Alternatives to Detention

- Support incentivization of increased diversion programming



Priority Area 3: Supportive Re-Entry

- Educational Advocate Programs

- Landscape analysis on Transition Aged Youth Programming
- Advocate for effective treatment models within institutional settings
- Collaborate with OSPI around increasing Ed. Advocate access
